

## **Second Singaporean makes Changi Millionaire shortlist**

*Purchase of toys for sons could be ticket to \$1 million*

**SINGAPORE, 11 November 2010** – Another Singaporean could become a millionaire after shopping at Changi Airport. Mr Ng Eng Sin, a 43-year-old business development manager, has been picked as the lucky monthly winner of the ‘Be a Changi Millionaire’ Draw for the month of September. He is the second Singaporean to become a monthly winner of the Millionaire Draw, giving him the incredible chance of winning the grand prize of S\$1 million.

Mr Ng, a father of two, had purchased two Lego toy sets for his sons aged seven and eight when he was at Changi Airport with his family in September. The purchases were made at KidzTime! at Terminal 3’s Departure Transit Mall when the Ng family were on their way to Penang to visit relatives and to celebrate the younger boy’s birthday.

Describing his reaction as being “surprisingly shocked and happy” when first informed about the win, Mr Ng said, “I feel that my lucky star is shining on me, being one of the six finalists. This is the first time I’ve come so close to winning S\$1 million.”

A frequent visitor to Changi Airport, Mr Ng enjoys shopping at Changi whenever he travels. “I think it is more than just an airport. It’s one of the icons of Singapore and more like a place of attraction. To us, it’s a mall where you can find anything and everything you need,” said Mr Ng. When not flying, he brings his family to the airport for dinner occasionally. Singaporeans contribute a significant 15% to total concession sales at Changi Airport.

As the monthly winner for September, Mr Ng wins S\$5,000 in cash plus a three day/two night stay in a luxurious hotel<sup>1</sup>. The 'Be a Changi Millionaire' Draw, which kicked off on 1 June 2010, has a Grand Prize of S\$1 million – possibly the largest cash prize ever to be given away in a retail draw in Singapore or by an airport anywhere in the world. The Millionaire will be selected from among six monthly winners, whose names are drawn upon the close of every month from June to November 2010. Besides the Grand Prize, there are 188 other cash prizes totalling more than S\$200,000.

Being the doting father that he is, Mr Ng's plans for the grand prize of S\$1 million, should he be the overall winner, naturally also involves his children. "I will definitely use it for my children's education and also for our retirement plan. I will also donate a portion to a charitable organisation," he said.

In January next year, Mr Ng will join a fellow Singaporean, an Australian, a South African and two other monthly winners in the 'Be a Changi Millionaire' Grand Draw. "I'm excited! I feel I'll be the 'lucky one'. My sons are my lucky charms!" he said.

### **Thirty daily winners**

In addition to the monthly winner, 30 daily winners (one each day) have also been drawn from the qualifying entries submitted during the month of September. Each wins a cash prize of S\$1,000. The daily winners comprise nationals of many countries including 11 from Singapore, three from China, and three from Indonesia. Other winners come from Australia, France, Greece, India, Italy, Malaysia, Mongolia, Pakistan, Taiwan, Thailand and the United States.

Winning entries ranged from a purchase of S\$110 on fashion accessories, to a S\$13,000 purchase on watches, both made at Terminal 1.

Purchases made in both the public and transit areas of Changi Airport qualify for the Draw. The qualifying period is 1 June 2010 to 30 November 2010.

The 'Be a Changi Millionaire' promotion will see a daily prize of S\$1,000 given over the 183 days of the qualifying period. After the close of each month, a monthly draw will be conducted to shortlist one finalist for participation in the Grand Draw. Apart from the chance to win S\$1 million, the finalists will win S\$5,000 in cash<sup>3</sup>, plus a three day/ two night stay in a luxurious hotel in Singapore, with airfare provided for non-Singapore residents. From among the six monthly finalists, the Changi Millionaire will be selected in an exciting Grand Draw that will take place at Changi Airport in January 2011.
